Deaf-Friendly Christmas Eve Service

Quick Tips

- Reserve an interpreter 3 weeks or more before Dec 24th.
- Promote having an interpreter.
- Don't dim the lights all the way, as Deaf people need to see the interpreter signing.
- Learn some Christmas-related signs.
- Have a children's choir or a youth choir sign a Christmas carol.
- Include Christian drama, as it's visual.
- Use visuals like multimedia.
- Use a sound system with a microphone and/or offer an assisted listening device or system.

Virtual Sign Language Classes

The United Methodist Committee on Deaf and Hard of Hearing Ministries is offering a FREE brief four -class sign language course. Types of classes are introduction class, a music focus, video instruction with feedback, and customized class. This brief sign language course can occur via FaceTime (ex. iPad), Skype (video conferencing), ZOOM on your laptop (the free version), or through a regular conference call. The class session can be seen on a laptop or projected onto a wall or screen to a group or one-onone to an instructor to teach the course. 
